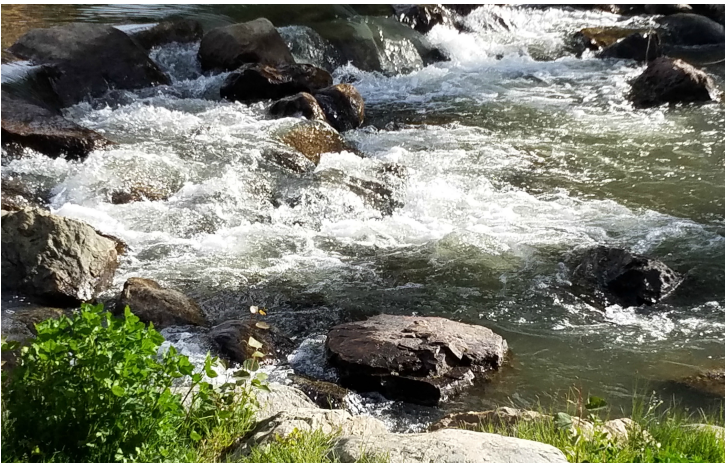


Dear friends,

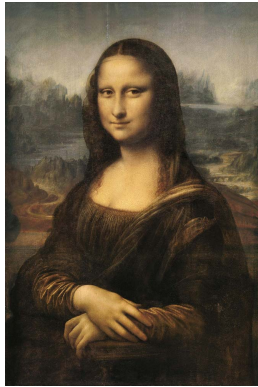

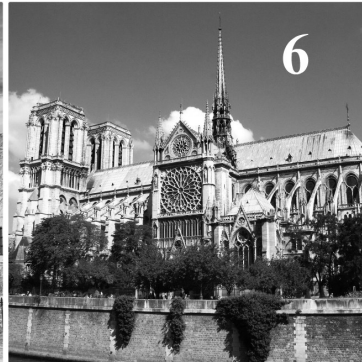
