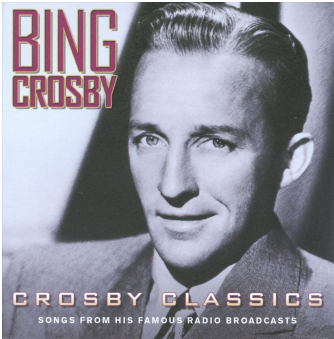


Dear friends,

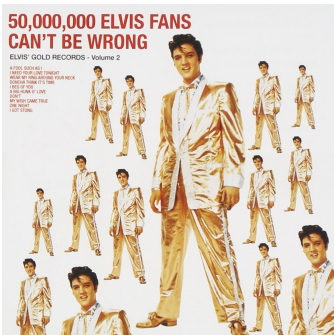

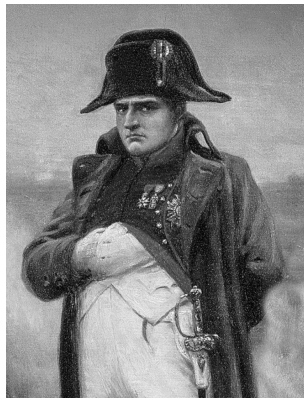

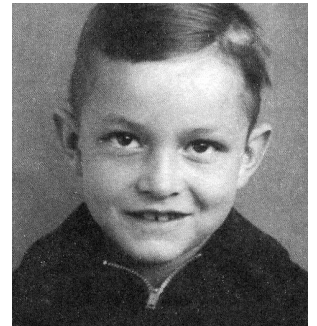
